Congratulations to our outstanding employees for 2015 – 2016!

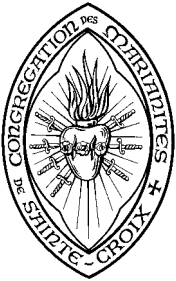
